I have considerable interest in the potential of roughland pasture renovation, with L. corniculatus (Birdsfoot Trefoil), in the Province of Nova Scotia.

The first project of this nature was started in September, 1968 and two more were started in September, 1969. Five different chemical treatments were used in the first project. Adequate plant productions were obtained in all treatments but the grass competition has been very strong. Although many of the trefoil seedlings appear to be too small and too weak to survive the winter, no definite conclusions are available as yet. Further comments and reports on these projects will be available at a later date.
