The list contains four sections, (1) all taxa presently on the list of endangered plants, (2) all taxa proposed for listing for which final action has not been taken, (3) a list of all taxa in categories (1) and (2), and (4) all taxa no longer considered as Endangered or Threatened having proven to be more abundant or widespread than was previously believed.

List (1) contains:

Lotus dendroides ssp. traskiae, San Clemente Island, California (Endangered)

List (3) contains:

*Lotus argophyllus spp. adsurgens, San Clemente Island, California

*Lotus argophyllus ssp. niveus, Santa Cruz Island, California

*Considered endangered

Additional information concerning these taxa, especially that resulting from recent investigations, is particularly sought by the Service.
