Birdsfoot Trefoil in eastern Canada

I had the pleasure of going on an agricultural tour of Newfoundland last July. I was favourably impressed with birdsfoot trefoil in several fields on their mineral soils. One interesting field near Gander had recovered a good stand in 1973 following such severe winter injury that no grass or legume hay was available for harvest in 1972. Fred Rayment has some good trials and a nice field of a Leo plus timothy mixture on the Research Station at St. John's. A problem that plagues trefoil stands in the Maritimes is that good stands are overrun with volunteer white clover. This does not appear to occur as commonly in Newfoundland.
