Lotus caucasicus

Dr. Dolan in the Northeastern Regional Plant Introduction Station report of 15 March 1973 notes: "An Interesting study in plant physiology could be made on Lotus caucasicus P.I. 325376. It came from Stavropol, USSR. During the summer months it sets seed abundantly at Geneva, but does not produce any seed at the National Plant Materials Center, SCS, Agricultural Research Center, Beltsville, Md. A guess is that long summer days are needed for blooming and setting seed. From a 16 ft. row at Geneva, we procured more than 100 g of seed."
