I note D. D. Dolan's comments on L. caucasicus (Lotus Newsletter 4:6, 1973). Reminds me of the performance of that Morshansk stock from which I selected Leo. In that one, the long summer days at Saskatoon, Saskatchewan - June 30, 1960, produced short erect plants with vigorous flowers while at Ames, Iowa, July 5, 1960, I observed very erratic flowering and long, straggly growth. Plants at Macdonald College, Ste. Anne de Bellevue, Quebec, were intermediate in flowering and growth habit. It would be interesting to check the response to daylength in Irving Carson's dwarfs (Lotus Newsletter 4:5, 1973). I wonder if the difference between field and greenhouse response is to daylength.
